By car — We're north of the town centre on the A4871, opposite the Main Line Station and the Queens Hotel.

By train — Porthmadog is served by trains on the scenic Cambrian Coast Line from Birmingham, Shrewsbury, Machynlleth, Barmouth & Pwllheli. For timetable details, call 08457 48 49 50 or visit www.thecambrianline.co.uk

By bus — The nearest bus stops are Gorsaf Porthmadog and Rhos Cambrian stops which are served by local buses. For full details visit www.traveline.info

By bicycle — Route 8 on the National Cycle Network "Lon Las Cymru" passes our entrance. There are bike racks at our station.

Parking is FREE at our station though it can get busy. A long-stay pay-&-display park is just across the road.

Toilets with disabled access and baby changing facilities are located at Porthmadog Station and at the Heritage Centre.

A wheel-chair accessible coach runs on all our trains; it's also useful for push-chairs.

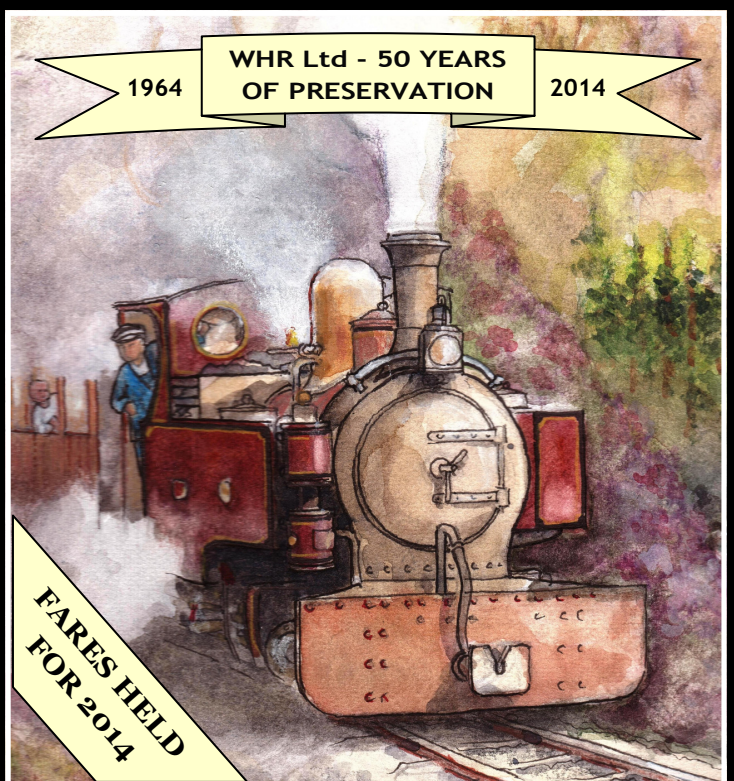

Journey into the past...

Siwrnai I'r gorffennol ...

Restored carriages on your train date from the North Wales Narrow Gauge Railway of a century ago and its successor, the Welsh Highland Railway.

When leaving Porthmadog, look out for the mountains where slate was quarried and brought down to the coast on the small railways.

It's about 3/4 mile to Pen y Mount where your children can help the guard to change the signals and points to allow the engine to 'run round' to join onto the other end of the train.

From Pen y Mount, the train returns to the award-winning Heritage Centre and Engine Sheds at Gelert's Farm. Here you can find out more about slate quarrying and the narrow gauge railways for which the area is famous.

There will be time to climb into the cabs of the locomotives and find out how things work, and to investigate the hands-on exhibits.

Before you leave Gelert's Farm, make sure you have a ride on the Miniature Railway through the woods and see the historic quarry wagons in the sidings.

Allow about an hour for your visit, but stay longer if you wish - **your ticket is valid all day.**

Afterwards, visit the **Russell Tea Room** where you can treat yourself to lunch or afternoon tea and our **Railway Gift Shop - which is Probably the best Railway Book Shop in Wales!**
