You will be given a warm welcome at our Porthmadog (WHHR) Station. The railway's gift, book and model shop is extremely well-stocked, ideal for any enthusiast and children of all ages. Call into Caffi Russell's Cafe for some freshly prepared food and drink. Remember to purchase your 'All Day' ticket (the ticket office is in the shop) for a fascinating journey through history!

The train waiting will be formed of historic carriages and one of our diesel or historic steam locomotives. Once the doors have been closed, we are ready for departure. The guard will show the green flag and we set off on the short journey to our station at Pen y Mount Junction.

Here the guard welcomes and invites you to alight from the train. Watch the signals change, see the engine running past before coupling back to the carriages. We're now ready to take you to our allweather railway heritage centre, where plenty of attractions await children and adults alike.

### 60th Anniversary Year

This year is our 60<sup>th</sup> birthday, which we are celebrating with special events in May and September. Our regular events continue, with An Evening of Steam and Song brought forward to June and our Santa Specials again rounding off the year.

### **GELERT'S FARM**

All trains stop over at the halt here and you are invited to visit our covered hands-on museum and our main train shed. All called after a farm because that's what was here back in the day!

You can climb on to the footplate of a real steam locomotive, explore the exhibits and ride the runaway train! See a little of the history of the railways of the area and how Porthmadog helped to bring narrow gauge railways to the world.

On the outside, children and adults of all ages can enjoy a ride on our miniature railway on most days and at no extra cost.

We then return to Porthmadog (WHHR) Station, in just under an hour after departing. Don't forget that you can do it all again, your ticket lasts

Our railway is mostly run by volunteers from all over the British Isles and even further.





### **HOW TO FIND US**

### SUT I DDOD O HYD I N

BY CAR - We're north of the town centre on the A4971, opposite the Cambrian Coast Line Station and the Queens Hotel.

BY TRAIN - Porthmadog is served by trains on the scenic Cambrian Coast Line from Birmingham, Shrewsbury, Machynlleth, Barmouth & Pwllheli. For timetable details visit tfwrail.wales/travel-updates/traintimes

BY BUS - The nearest bus stops are Gorsaf Porthmadog and Rhes Cambrian stops which are served by TrawsCymru and local buses. For full details visit www.traveline.cymru

**BY BICYCLE** - Route 8 on the National Cycle Network "Lon Las Cymru" passes our entrance. There are bike racks at our station.

Parking is FREE at our station though it can get busy. A long-stay pay-&-display park is just across the road.

Toilets with disabled access and baby changing facilities are located at Porthmadog (WHHR) Station and at the museum.

A wheel-chair accessible coach runs on all our trains; it's also useful for push-chairs.


